




Mapping the Way: Public education resources and promotional materials




We have various public education resources aiming to deepen public understanding of the history of treaty negotiations and self-government implementation in the Yukon..






Public education	Infographic panel	 <p>MAPPING THE WAY: Yukon First Nation Self-Government</p> <p>Yukon is one of Canada's three northern territories, and is home to about 37,000 residents.</p> <p>There are 14 First Nations in Yukon. Approximately 23% of Yukon's population is Aboriginal, with most belonging to one of the 14 Yukon First Nations.</p> <p>First Nation people have lived in Yukon for thousands of years.</p> <p>1876 The Indian Act becomes law and sets out certain Government of Canada obligations, and regulates who is defined as an Indian and the management of Indian band land, money and resources.</p> <p>1898 The Klondike Gold Rush brings thousands of gold seekers to Yukon.</p> <p>1902 Taku Haidliin Chief Am Sias recognizes the effect newly arrived settlers have on Yukon First Nations. He writes to the Government of Canada requesting compensation for his people's loss of land and hunting grounds.</p> <p>1973 Together Today for Our Children Tomorrow</p> <p>Yukon land claim negotiations begin when Ullip Smith and Yukon First Nation leaders present a ground-breaking document, Together Today for Our Children Tomorrow, to their Canadian Prime Minister Pierre Elliott Trudeau.
